Frozen Cherry Salad

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
1 carton (8 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed
1 can (21 ounces) cherry pie filling

2 cans (11 ounces each) mandarin oranges, drained
Maraschino cherries and orange wedges, optional

Prep Time: 10 min Yield: 12 servings

- In a large bowl, combine cream cheese and whipped topping. Stir in pie filling. Fold oranges into cream cheese mixture.
- Transfer to a 9x5-in. loaf pan. Cover and freeze overnight. Remove from freezer 15 minutes before cutting. Garnish with cherries and orange wedges if desired.

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Everybody's Talking

Fishing prescription: In England, some health workers can now point patients toward a fishing session as part of care for anxiety or low mood. The option comes through Tackling Minds, a program started by Dave Lyons after fishing helped steady his own life. Instead of a clinic visit, people join small groups by the water with volunteer coaches who bring gear and show the basics. The focus is simple: get outside, slow down, and have something to do with your hands. The group works with the National Health Service under social prescribing, alongside other supports. It recently received the King's Award for Voluntary Service, a national honour. Organizers say they want more communities to have the same kind of access.

Language revival: In a remote part of northwest Australia, a small Aboriginal community is using a phone game to bring its traditional language back into daily life. Instead of classroom lessons, young players explore a digital landscape based on local landscapes while hearing words spoken by elders. Language is folded into simple tasks, letting learning happen through play. Community leaders chose this format knowing screens already hold kids' attention. Repeated interactions help rebuild familiarity with sounds and meanings that were fading. By tying words to places and everyday actions, the game keeps learning grounded. Organizers see it as an entry point for broader cultural learning using modern tools.

Hidden whales: Near Baja California, Mexico, scientists spotted two living ginkgo-toothed beaked whales, a species that had never been confirmed alive before. Researchers had recorded a strange underwater sound in the area for years but didn't know which animal made it. This sighting finally linked that sound to these whales, giving scientists a new way to track them. The team couldn't get a clear photo, so they used a very small skin sample to confirm the species. Beaked whales are hard to study because they surface briefly and avoid boats. Until now, most information came from whales found washed up on beaches after dying at sea. The discovery shows they regularly live off the coast of Mexico, not just far-off oceans.

Silent scores: In Germany, two short organ works believed to be early pieces by Johann Sebastian Bach have finally been performed after about 320 years in storage. The music surfaced in an archive as handwritten pages without names or dates, leaving their origin uncertain for years. Close study of the writing style later linked them to Bach's early training period. Once experts felt confident, the pieces were prepared for performance at a church closely tied to Bach's working life. Hearing them added fresh detail to a composer thought to be fully documented. The moment showed that archives can still hold surprises. For listeners, it offered new sounds from a familiar name.
